About the Phoenix Dream Center: Founded in 2006, The Phoenix Dream Center (PDC) is a faith-based organization providing social services and community programs to homeless, abused and impoverished high risk youth, individuals and families in **crisis free of charge —24 hours a day, seven days a week.**

Our Mission: To reach in and mine the incredible potential we believe lies within the lives of at-risk youth, the homeless, and the needy families of our community by restoring hope and allowing them to dream again. In a safe environment, we are able to meet basic needs of food, shelter, and clothing and provide the supportive services and resources to help them realize their dream of living a self-sufficient life.

Our Vision: To become an inner city resource that will help distribute hope to homeless, food to the hungry, clothes to the naked, and restoration to the broken.

Our Programs: Currently PDC serves over 40,000 people each month through a variety of programs described in more detail on the reverse side of this page.

Dream Center Life Recovery Program:

A faith-based, residential recovery program that helps men and women overcome substance abuse, anger management and emotional struggles. Within a highly structured format residents are taught to overcome addictions and abuses, and to mend broken or strained relationships with the goal of reuniting with their families.

Dream Center Transitional Living:

Participants of this program are provided affordable housing, job training and taught basic life skills that will enable them to build substantive and successful families and careers.

Dream Center Rescue Project:

Operates two separate homes for underage girls and adult women (18-30) who have been rescued from human trafficking and sex slavery from the streets of Phoenix. The Rescue Project is specifically designed to meet all of their needs including spiritual, emotional and medical needs in a loving and caring environment. It is our goal that upon leaving our home every young woman will be equipped to live a healthy independent life.

Dream Center Hunger Relief:

PDC serves over 9,000 meals weekly, by operating an onsite cafeteria and delivering bagged groceries to homeless, low-income and food insecure families at over 20 sites throughout Phoenix. Recipients include single mothers, families living below the poverty level, disabled individuals, the unemployed, and the elderly. This program helps to alleviate hunger in some of the most impoverished communities in Phoenix.

Dream Center Adopt-A-Block Neighborhood Revitalization:

Every Saturday, teams of volunteers go into neighborhoods throughout Phoenix to specifically assist high risk, underprivileged youth and their families. Services offered to the youth include transportation to the center, groceries for their families, back to school supplies, tutoring and inspirational and motivational events. Volunteers also do housework, repair homes, clear yards, pick-up trash, paint over graffiti and distribute food, clothing and household items. Neighborhood revitalization events reach over 500 high risk children and teens through our bus and community outreach programs. These children are met where they are in the community and are offered clean and healthy alternative activities.
